#### COVID-19 ADVISORY FOR KENTUCKY LICENSED OPTOMETRISTS

The Commonwealth of Kentucky takes very serious the threat posed by the novel coronavirus outbreak in state and across the globe. In response the Kentucky Board of Optometric Examiners ("Board") advised of the Governor's Order dated March 17, 2020 limiting the practice of Optometry. Now the Board advises that the Governor has announced the gradual reopening of our Phase 1 health care services and facilities, including Optometry. See Governor's April 23, 2020 announcement. Responding to the Governor's request that professional associations and trade organizations submit plans for responsible reopening, the Kentucky Optometric Association worked with this Board, and submitted guidelines to the Governor and the Kentucky Department of Public Health. Beginning, April 27, 2020, Optometrists may recommence practicing optometry according to guidelines published on April 25, 2020 and the following clarifications pertaining to PPE, as well as information regarding in-office procedures:

### **PPE Clarification:**

This clarification addresses an inconsistency, which was created by the timing of when the Optometry Reopening Guidelines were submitted (April 23<sup>rd</sup>) and when Governor Beshear issued his comprehensive Order for all healthcare facilities in Phase 1 (April 27<sup>th</sup>).

Specifically, the use of protective eye wear and gloves when "interacting with patients" is interpreted as "direct person-person contact with patients." Please note that masks should be worn during all interactions with patients, consistent with Governor Beshear's Order.

This change in the attached Guidelines can be found in <u>Personal Protective Equipment & Protective Measures</u> (Page 5):



- All doctors and staff members should wear masks, protective eyewear, and gloves when interacting with patients.
  - o The use of protective eyewear and gloves when "interacting with patients" is interpreted as "direct person-person contact with patients." This clarification is consistent with Governor Beshear's Healthcare Facilities Phase 1 Reopening, see Order <u>HERE</u>.

## **In-Office Procedures:**

The KOA has received the following direction from the KY Board of Optometric Examiners (BOE) pertaining to in-office procedures.

All in-office procedures may resume. This includes in-office laser procedures (YAG, ALT, SLT, LPI),
medicine injections, and the removal of 'lumps and bumps' around the eyes. Offices should utilize their
normal patient screening process. There is no requirement for a negative COVID-19 test by the patient
for these in-office procedures. Procedures taking place in hospitals and surgical centers may require a
negative COVID-19 test.
